- 1. Welcome and Introductions (KN)
- 2. Approval of Agenda and Minutes: (AWM approved; HG second for both)
 Discussion re: snacks vs. pizza at PAC meetings. Will have only snacks moving forward.
- 3. Seismic Report (DK)

Lots of walls up, sometime this week first floor panels will go in, need to be flexible with timelines, portion of Garden street will be blocked off for crane, lost some time over summer due to contractors, masonry, etc. But still roughly on the same completion timeline for August, but may start September in the old building and transition to the new building. Completing power for the new building, building big trench for it at entrance way, but waiting on BC Hydro for approval, kids will be able to go around the whole school, but not at this point. Contractor had trouble with city related to parking. **DO NOT PARK** on southside of Kitchener st from Garden to Lakewood as getting complaints and could delay construction. Notice will go out to families and try to avoid parking there when possible. Structural steel is up, need to level, and then floor panels to go in, crane will be parked at south-east corner, and road closed there.

4. Financial Report (LM)

Great year of raising funds

\$70 000 at start of last year (September 2016)

\$123 000 at end of year last year (June 2017) including \$4 000 contingency

Will have statement soon for end of August

KN did recap of why we are raising funds – aiming for \$200 000 that will cover items not covered by VSB for the new school. Also items that we fund as a PAC regardless of the new build.

Fundraising: coffee, movie nights, family pics, silent auction, parent info nights, purdeys, poinsettias, donalds gift cards, carnival, gaming grants

Controls in place with LN PAC so that no one can take money without authorization. Laura to call to follow up re: gaming grant and to find out about this year's grant.

More information to follow from administration. Not an opportunity to discuss your child, more to meet teacher, see classroom, etc.

Discussion re: student-led conferences vs. talking to teacher without student present. More an opportunity for child to show you what they are doing vs. discussing what is written on the report card. Works on goal setting, specific to child. Can make an appointment to discuss specific needs with teacher at a later time. Some discussion regarding finding out more information regarding what is being taught in the classroom.

8. Admin Report

School year underway.

School organization: 462 students, 77 are English language learners, 28 special needs students, 21 divisions (20 divisions and primary austism district program)

New staff, some here temporarily, but are still doing some interviews

New councellor: Leslie Germine (M, T, R) 2.5 days a week

Grade 6/7: Ms. Scott/Mr. Volkerath - temporary job share and will be interviewing for position and will have a full-time position

Grade 5/6: Ms. Fong is in a temporary position, and are interviewing for position

Grade 1 – Mrs. Sullivan is on leave, but are interviewing for position. Ms Dredge in currently.

KG Mrs. Klein/Mrs. Tam – job share open as Mrs. Tam took a position elsewhere. Ms. Hsu in currently for position, but temporary spot.

Mrs. Rosati – job sharing in position

Now 4 supervision aids (up from 3 positions). New supervision is Ms. Cavezza.

Primary Autism District Program – filling position in autism program, currently a resource staff is managing that position, also new staff in that program, only one returning staff for that program

Discussion re: what influences hiring process (seniority vs. fit for position). Interesting times as lots of new teachers getting positions from graduating.

Rational regarding split classroom: Can only have a certain number of kids in a class (KG is 20, primary is 22, intermediate is 30). Split classes is -2, special needs is -1, etc. Sometimes have to structure classes creatively as if there are multiple children with IEPs/special needs, then they can't all be in the same classroom. Trying to sort out RTI (responsive to intervention) for some classes (i.e. math for Grade 7s) as because of smaller class sizes, resources are spread out more over more classes. If band comes back, it will be user pay but parents will have to advocate for it.

New building is being built for 20 divisions

Mrs. Mould and others taking on cross country and will be Grade 2-7 related to stamina and supervision needs. If a Grade 2 parent is super keen and will be 1:1 with child at an event, then may be allowed. Might have a km club for Grade 1/2s.

GymSense – gymnastics program in October for 3+ weeks

Terry Fox Run – Sept. 28

Pro D Day - Sept. 22

Fire Drill (first of 6) – Week of Sept 25-29th, but waiting for the nicest day

Two earthquake drill – first around Great BC Shakeout (mid Oct) and the Big One (first Tuesday in Feb). One with practice for release.

Code Red/Lockdown drill – will potentially have police do a walkabout. Aim for children to be out of sight, lights off, doors locked, children quiet, etc.

Universal Washrooms – in front of gym for anyone to use

There are also washrooms marked as teachers, family, males, females, etc.

Other washrooms have locks that are more challenging for children to manipulate

New building will have stalls in all washrooms, and could be made more as universal washrooms

Mr. Knibbs has the Criterion package for the PAC to use.

Few new classrooms that have come in, looking for Lego, Trains, house centre donations

Added two new classrooms (replacing computer lab and OSC room). Nearly every space in the school is being utilized. Using Strong Start room. Have had to change the gym schedule – 2 blocks per class allocation due to logistics and scheduling—teachers allowed to use activity room as well as going outside.

Looking into mobile technology with the district before committing. Looking at \$25 000-\$30 000 for mobile technology unit. MAC vs Chrome Book. Potential for PAC to fund at some point.

Discussion re: teacher stipend. Last year PAC donated \$3850. Discussion re: how to break it down.

For next year, approximately 60 Grade 7s to graduate so approximately that many student placements for enrollment in KG (and elsewhere).

Discussion re: OSC classroom being used as a classroom but not a lot of light or ventilation in that room. Cost prohibitive to do any renos in that space with the new build occurring. Music room has smart board so cannot switch that space due to cost re: electricians, contractors, etc.. StrongStart is a district space with 25 student plus adults on a daily basis. Unfortunately no cost effective solution. Not sure the purpose of the cage around that door, as it blocks light from the room, potentially related to vandalism. Lots of challenges in VSB district with classroom setups.

Lunch program cancelled as not meeting the threshold of numbers. PAC/parents could revive the lunch program but needs a parent to spearhead. Discussion re: Queen Victoria lunch program as it is very well received. Use Grade 5s to distribute food. Would need to be stringent related to VSB guidelines. Also option for CST program to help with children that are not bringing lunches or enough food to sustain them during school. District was funding lunch program as was 70-80 children and needed to be 125 minimum. Need to look into providers. Emily and Sarah to look into it, as well as look into distribution of food to those who would be interested. KN to follow up. Children will be eating lunches in classrooms in new school. Appears to be quieter in the lunch room than before potentially related to the noise minimized from lack of the lunch program.

Discussion re: after school care and if that is being factored into the new build.

Lots of costumes stored in the school, but need to be gone by Oct. 31st. If anyone is interested in purchasing costumes, talk to Angela or Kate. All of the costumes are catalogued.
